[Design & Management] Regulations



The Construction [Design and Management] Regulations are often misunderstood by personnel new to construction related works, which can often lead to accidents, non-compliance and ultimately prosecution. Due to the poor health and safety record of the construction industry, the HSE have been targeting sites involving construction works. Where inadequacies are found they are increasingly imposing improvement notices, prohibition notices and even prosecutions. It is therefore in the interest of all parties involved with the design, letting and execution of construction projects that they fully understand the CDM Regulations. This course provides the delegate with all the necessary legal and practical information to conform with these requirements.
